



Hoots and Hisses at Assateague State Park

Date: **Sunday, July 15, 2018**

Time: **1:30 PM to 2:30 PM**

Meeting Point: **Nature Center at Assateague State Park** (check in at Ranger Station first)

An exciting up-close look at some of Assateague's most interesting inhabitants -- the screech owl, corn snake, and eastern box turtle. What adaptations do these animals have that help them to survive on the island? Learn about their habitat and importance in the island ecosystem.

Please check in at the Assateague State Park Ranger Station (see directions below). The ranger will open the gate for you to drive to the Nature Center.

Number of spaces available: No limit. Please sign up for the event at www.actforbays.org/coastkids, or by calling the Assateague Coastal Trust office at 410-629-1538. Leave a message with your name, phone number, and number of participating kids. The event is free for members and costs \$3 per child for non-members.

Directions: *Ocean City:* Take Rt. 611 toward Assateague Parks. Cross the bridge to Assateague Island, then turn right on the second road toward State Park Ranger Station/camping registration. Stop at the Ranger Station, so they can open the gate to the road to the Nature Center. The Nature Center is on your left half way through the camp ground.

From Salisbury: Take Rt. 50E. Turn right onto Rt. 113S, then left onto Rt. 376 following the signs toward Assateague Parks. Turn right onto Rt. 611, cross the bridge to Assateague Island, then turn right on the second road toward State Park Ranger Station/camping registration. Stop at the Ranger Station, so they can open the gate to the road to the Nature Center. The Nature Center is on your left half way through the camp ground.
