Paddling on the Upper Pocomoke River

Date: **Saturday, June 7, 2025**

Paddling on the upper part of the Pocomoke River feels like going through a jungle of huge Bald

Cypress trees, waterlilies, and tangled vines. This part of the river is home to beavers, otters, and lots of turtles and birds. The launch area is a smooth riverbank which makes it easy to climb in and out of the boats. We will provide kayaks, a canoe, and life vests. No paddling experience is needed. Please wear water shoes and clothes that may get wet (water dripping off paddles!) and bring bug spray, sunscreen, a hat, and water. If you have binoculars, they might be fun to use for bird watching.

Leave a message with your name, phone number, and number of participating kids. The event is free for members and costs \$15 per person for non-members. Directions: *From Berlin/Ocean City:* Go south on Rt. 113. After passing Worcester Technical High School, turn right onto Porters Crossing Rd. The boat launch is located at the small bridge about 1 mile from the turn.

From Pocomoke City: Drive north on Rt. 113. U-turn at Worcester Technical High School. Turn right onto Porters Crossing Rd. The boat launch is located at the small bridge about 1 mile from the turn.

From Salisbury: Take Rt. 12 E toward Snow Hill. Turn left onto Rt. 354 (Whiton Rd), then turn right onto Porters Crossing Rd. The boat launch is about 1 mile from the turn.
